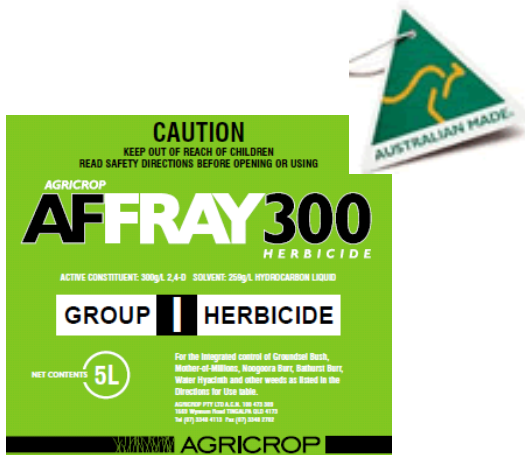




Using Affray 300 Herbicide to control Mother-of-Millions



Control Strategy

Several practices are recommended to prevent the spread and growth of Mother-of-Millions:

- Where possible establish more desirable pasture plants to compete with future germinations of Mother of Millions.
- Ensure scattered infestations on properties and in dumping areas are checked regularly and controlled with a herbicide.

Chemical Control

AFFRAY 300 Herbicide is one of the most commonly used products for control of Mother-of-Millions. It was developed by the Department of Lands Allan Fletcher Research Station in Qld. AFFRAY 300 does not affect established pasture grasses however avoid use in recently sown pasture. When spraying avoid conditions that may impede maximum performance of the chemical: Thorough spray coverage is essential as each leaf has many plantlets along its edge. These plantlets drop readily, develop roots and establish quickly to form a colony. Although AFFRAY 300 is non-volatile, care must be taken to avoid physical spray drift on to desirable plants. Use low pressure nozzles and spray in relatively calm conditions. When flowering in winter, infestations are easier to see and seeds are prevented from becoming viable.

Application and rates

Affray 300 should be applied at a rate of 70 mL/10L water when Knapsack spraying and 7L/1000L water when using a hand gun. Thorough even coverage on leaves and plantlets is necessary.
